Good Bye from the CIP Team

The South East CIP will no longer be operating after the 31st August 2011 in its current form. The CIP Team will not be in post beyond this date and any future extended services activities will need to be coordinated and delivered either through smaller clusters or by individual schools. The CIP office and contact details will be shut down after this time, parents and partners have been informed of this.

We would like to thank you for your support over the last 5 years and we wish you all the best with your future delivery of extended services.

CIP Evaluation Report

The South East CIP have worked very hard as a team and partnership to put together a final Impact and Evaluation Report that provides some real tangible outcomes for families and children within the south east area. The report looks at the diverse scope of work that the CIP has been involved with and demonstrates the real difference that has been made to the lives of hundreds of children and their families.

The SE CIP has been in existence now for 5 years and will cease to continue in this format in the future so we wanted to use this opportunity to answer that question that everyone asks. The So what? Where has been your impact? What difference have you really made?

Well.... the report contains the answers. The team have put together a final evaluation for everyone who has worked with us in the past to finally answer that question and show that actually the CIP really did help a lot of families. The report provides a range of statistical data, consultation feedback, evaluation forms, graphs, facts and figures covering all of the work we have ever done and it is a lot.

In terms of how you can now benefit from this information provided, well it will definitely provide you with a range of real data for your school reports on extended services, evaluation reviews, OFSTED and not forgetting helping you decide what it is you wish to continue into the future. What worked for you and what do you think shows the greatest impact for

your target audience, which is likely to be the same as ours - all your children and their families.

The report is being distributed to a range of our partners such as Schools, Governing bodies, our Steering group, providers, and councillors to name a few.

CIP Evaluation DVD

The report also accompanies a more visual representation of evaluation in the form of a DVD for those who work better with that type of format. The CIP worked with partners, local children, young people, families and a local drama company to create, film and produce the DVD that outlined the CIPs Journey from its beginnings to its legacy and sustainability. A format was developed that involved children and young people telling the story of the CIP in the form of a News Programme. This gave them the opportunity to participate and celebrate their involvement in activities organised by the CIP, it also enabled them to develop their drama skills and learn more about the processes involved in making a film.

The News Programme visits the 4 themed areas of the CIPs work: Boost Funding, health lifestyles, parenting support and communications. All introductions and interviews were delivered by children and young people. Additional interviews were carried out with parents and professionals that have worked and benefited from the CIP projects over the last 5 years. The result is a fun and interesting look at the work of the CIP that we hope professionals will find useful when planning their extended services into the future. This DVD is being distributed to partners with our Evaluation and Impact Report.

CIP Community Map and Community Facilities Directory

The CIP team will leave the partnership with a range of useful and up-to-date information. This has been provided in the form of the recently updated Community Map and Community Facilities Directory. Following on from the first editions success, the Map and Directory were updated in July 2011. The second version was produced as it was felt it would be an effective way of signposting local services in to the future after the CIP has come to an end.

The Map and Directory were both improved to reflect feedback we had received from partners and families during 2010. These will be distributed to Schools and Community facilities in August/early September 2011.

Asset and funding split

The SE CIP assets have been fairly distributed between interested parties. The majority of the CIP office furniture and equipment will be taken on by Meon Junior School for an agreed fee. The resources and items of little value have been shared out amongst those who have demonstrated an interest. These items will be delivered to those schools in early September.

Any remaining SE CIP funding will be distributed amongst the Southsea Cluster, Milton Cluster, Mary Rose School and St Swithun's School. The plans for using this funding have been collated and sent to the Children's Trust Board to take on monitoring responsibilities. The exact amounts will be calculated on a per child on roll basis and will be confirmed in late September/early October with the likely transfer of funding to occur in November.
